Dear Colleague,

On behalf of the Faculty Staff Union, we are pleased to welcome you to UMass Boston and urge you to not only become a member of FSU – but be actively engaged in your union.

This is a unique time to be starting at UMass Boston. After working remotely for over a year, we are returning to campus in the midst of a global pandemic that continues to threaten our workplace and higher education. We suspect that many of you – like us – are excited to connect with colleagues and students, but apprehensive about what the academic year holds. It's a challenging time.

For these reasons (and many others), it is more important than ever that we continue to build a strong union for faculty and librarians – one that allows us to collectively fight for health and safety at work while pushing for better salaries, working conditions, and job security. The FSU provides members with many tangible benefits (<https://www.mtabenefits.com/>), but ultimately a strong union is what gives us a collective voice to advance not only our own interests, but those of our students and public higher education more broadly.

Approximately 90% of UMass Boston faculty and librarians are members of the FSU because they support the work of the union, understand that the challenges we face will only be solved through collective action, and recognize that the union plays a vital role in the life of the university. The more union members we have, the more leverage we have at the bargaining table, at the State House, and with our Administration.

This is your union, and its effectiveness and visibility in the affairs of UMass Boston and in public higher education as a whole depends on your participation (fortunately, union service counts as university service in reviewing faculty performance!).

The FSU and our affiliate chapter on the Amherst campus, the Massachusetts Society of Professors (MSP), serve as the exclusive bargaining agent for the over 2,300 university faculty and librarians on the two campuses. The FSU is affiliated with the Massachusetts Teachers Association (MTA) on the state level and the National Education Association (NEA) on the national level. The MTA provides us with legal and other support services as well as a member of its professional staff who works full-time with the Boston and Amherst faculty and librarians. The MTA is also the strongest voice for public education in state – with the legislature and Governor.

The 2021-2022 academic year dues are \$1,006 per full-time member of which \$301 supports the FSU, \$503 supports the MTA and \$202 the NEA (members who are less than full-time will have their dues rates pro-rated; see [here](#) for details). Most members elect automatic monthly

deductions from payroll as their preferred means of satisfying their dues obligation. Dues paid in this fashion are made over a ten-month period, September through June.

A union membership form is included in this packet. **You are not automatically a member; you must fill out the paperwork and submit it to the FSU in order to join.** Please return it as soon as possible to the Faculty Staff Union: [fsu@umb.edu](mailto:fsu@umb.edu) (deductions cannot begin until the membership form is returned).
